Note for Question 19:

Employees can claim home office expenses if the following conditions are met:

- They worked > 50% of the time from home for at least 4 consecutive weeks in 2022; and
- The expenses were used directly in their work during the period.

Employees can use the **detailed method** to claim actual expenses paid for the period that they worked from home. Under this method, employees <u>must</u>:

- Calculate the size of the work space,
- Keep supporting documents, and
- Obtain Form T2200 (or T2200S) from the employer.

Alternatively, for 2022 only, employees can use a **simplified method** (or the "**temporary flat rate method**") to claim \$2 per day, up to a maximum of 250 days (or \$500 total). Under this method, employees do <u>not</u> have to provide details or obtain Form T2200 from the employer.
